

Opening Program



From the Desktop Shortcut

- Simply double-click on the [TrueBook](#) shortcut icon on your desktop.

If you don't see the TrueBook shortcut on your desktop, you can make one easily. Just find the TrueBook shortcut in the TrueBook folder (usually in [C:\TrueBook24](#)), copy it, and then paste it on your desktop. This way, you'll have a shortcut for quick access.

Opening from the Program Folder

- Navigate to the Program Folder, which is usually located at [C:\TrueBook24](#). Here, you will find various files and folders.

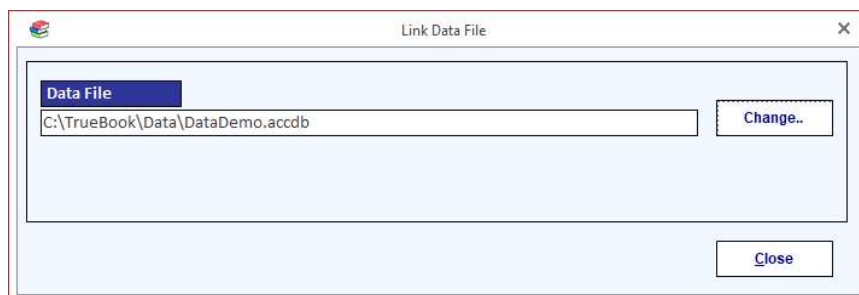
- Locate and double-click on the [TrueBook](#) shortcut.

Once the program opens, you will be greeted with the [Login Screen](#).

Note (for backend MS Access database):

If you encounter the [Link Data File](#) screen instead, it could be due to several reasons:

- The data file is not properly linked with the program.¹
- The data file has been moved to a different location.¹
- The data file's name has been changed.¹
- The data file is corrupt.²
